I refer to your letter addressed to 20 December 2011.

I offer my sincere apologies for misinterpreting what was required by your earlier correspondence. Thank you for providing a further opportunity for QFRS to clarify the entries on the schedule which is attachment "LAJ - 1' to Commissioner Johnson's statement, and to provide more detail of QFRS' response in Grantham.

Firstly, I would like to take this opportunity to better explain why the ICC crews were referred to in the spreadsheet provided, what an incident control centre is, and how it operates.

I have also included answers to your specific questions, which have been of assistance. Please be assured, I am keen to ensure that all relevant information in the possession of QFRS is made available to you.

The following calls for assistance, included in attachment "LAJ – 1", were initially logged with the Fire Communications Centre and entered on the Emergency Services Computer Aided Dispatch (ESCAD) system. This created an incident number (e.g. QF6-11-002910), a priority, and generated a job for a fire crew to respond.

The Fire Communications Supervisors for the Fire Communications Centre (South East) who were on duty on 10 January 2011 were Spalding – Day Shift.

At approximately 16:58 hours, the Fire Communications Centre checked with four different fire vehicles (call-signs 673A, 675Y, Hattonvale 53 and Hattonvale 52), to see if they were able to access Grantham by road. The recordings of these calls (electronically and transcribed) are attached and marked "Attachment 1A" and "Attachment 1B". Those vehicles were attempting (via differing routes) to access Grantham, and each vehicle advised that they were not able to access Grantham as they had been cut off by flood waters.

At this time, it was no longer possible for FireComm (South East) to task particular fire crews to respond to incidents in Grantham.

An Incident Control Centre was set up and operational from approximately 19:15 hours (7:15pm), due to the scale of the response required. FireComm provided a faxed list of outstanding incidents to the ICC at approximately 19:43 hours (7:43pm). It contains 8 of the 11 incidents (3 incidents were received on, or after, this time). A copy of this document is attached, and now includes the reference to the FireComm incident number. See "Attachment 2". This list is attachment "LAJ-10" to the Commissioner's statement.

The term "ICC Crew" was entered on the spreadsheet by the FireComm Analysis Team to denote that the incident had been referred to the Gatton Incident Control Centre for response.

As Station Officer ("SO") Mark Stephenson was the Operations Officer in the ICC, it was his role to task and direct the crews in Grantham. He was assisted by the Gatton ICC incident controller

SO Mark Stephenson has advised me that the following operational methodology was used or applied in coordinating the response during the above period:

The most effective and efficient way of tasking and accounting for crews on the fireground, due to nature of the flooding events was, that QFRS personnel were broken into swift water teams, comprising of Level 2 Swift Water Rescue Technicians and other QFRS operational staff.

The vehicle and crew in each team are detailed in the attached table marked "Attachment 3"

Other personnel were operationally active in the surrounds of Grantham, whilst not necessarily working in the flooded environment of Grantham. A table detailing all personal responding from the Gatton ICC was attachment "LAJ-3" of the Commissioner's statement, and is attached again (for your convenience) and marked "Attachment 4".

[Note: there was some overlap of geographical area by crews, and there may have been minor crew changes throughout the night, as a result of operational requirements.]

- Station Officer Phil Paff was the nominated point of contact between Swift water teams 2 and 3, and the ICC. SO Stephenson communicated with SO Paff by way of mobile telephone to facilitate tasking of the outstanding incidents. Swift water team 1 liaised with the ICC directly.
- Whilst completing the outstanding the FireComm incidents (refer to "Attachment 2"), Swift water teams also systematically conducted house-to-house search and rescue operations, providing assistance to residents in each street as required. As tasks were completed, this was reported to SO Stephenson at the ICC.

For example, incidents: QF6-11-002922, QF6-11-002971, QF6-11-003032 and QF6-11-003013 all had an incident address of Harris Street. Swift water team 3 conducted a house-to-house search of Harris Street in its entirety, conducting rescues.

This action ensured that all of the outstanding FireComm incidents in that location had been attended, as well as the area being checked for persons needing immediate assistance. Details of the other Swift water teams, who attended the balance of the incident locations, are detailed in the table marked "Attachment 4".

4) Crews were sent to the streets where the incidents were reported rather than being tasked to specific addresses, as the operations were being conducted at night and in a flooded location (with most homes still submerged to varying degree and having suffered enormous damage). This made house identification by specific street number extremely difficult. A map showing the areas that each Swift water team operated in is attached and marked "Attachment 5".

Several of the fire-fighters involved have given statements regarding their involvement in the search and rescue operations, and I have highlighted those parts relevant to Grantham and the actions described above. Those statements are attached and marked as follows:

[Note: Some of the above statements were taken internally for the purpose of formally recognising the efforts of crews.]

In relation to your other specific questions relating to the eleven incidents responded to by an ICC Crew.

1. Did a crew (s) in fact attend the incident?

Swift water team 1: comprising of Swift Water Rescue Technicians Brad Mills and Andrew Neil attended incident: QF6-11-002910.

Swift water team 2: comprising of Swift Water Rescue Technicians Phil Paff, Nathan Chadwick, Russell Von-Nider and Shane Bretz, and auxiliary fire-fighters Mark Meier, Mark Dionysius and Neil Barrett attended incidents: QF6-11-002919 and QF6-11-002921.

Swift water team 3: comprising of Swift Water Rescue Technicians and attended incidents: QF6-11-002922, QF6-11-002933, QF6-11-002971, QF6-11-003032, QF6-11-003013, QF6-11-003017, QF6-11-003024, QF6-11-003036.

2 (a). From what station was it (they) drawn?

The table at "Attachment 3" provides a detailed breakdown of each crew member and the station at which they are usually based.

[Note: the crews may have been formed by fire-fighters from different stations]

2 (b) and (c). When did it (they) attend, and with what result (s)?

Due to issues with the QFRS operational software systems (EIAP) in the ICC, there is no electronic record of the time that each job was completed, or the specific actions undertaken at that job.

However, I have reviewed statements provided by fire officers and obtained information from officers present, during the events of 10 January. Although it is difficult to ascertain the specific time when a particular incident was completed, all the incidents were completed by approximately 1.00am.

The table at "Attachment 4" provides a detailed breakdown of the incident, crew, time and outcome .

Future action

QFRS has reviewed its operational procedures for large scale incidents and introduced a new *Standing Order: Recording of Data for Large Scale Incidents* for major and complex events, such as those experienced in January this year. See "**Attachment 13.**"

Once a "Large Scale Incident" has been classified as such, the procedure now provides for an Operations Management System (OMS) operator [to manage crewing of vehicle details] and a Fire Communications Officer [to operate the Emergency Services Computer Aided Dispatch (ESCAD)] to provide staffing support at the Incident Control Centre.

The provision of a Fire Communications Officer will provide for dispatch, arrival and job details to be recorded directly into the ESCAD system, rather then relying on other means.

In addition, the provision of Fire Communication Officers with ESCAD access in ICCs, will allow Incident Management Teams to view "real time job information" as it appears in the ESCAD system. It is anticipated that these changes will improve the QFRS recording and response systems in the event of major incidents.

I can assure you that QFRS is committed to recognising opportunities for improvement and building upon them in the future. Once again, I apologise for any inconvenience, and please don't hesitate to contact me if you require any additional information.






