Special Consultation Sessions Planned

ouncil has planned a series of special consultation sessions to be held in the first week of February next year to discuss its rates, valuations and budgeting processes.

These meetings will be open to all ratepayers and residents.

The Mayor has advised senior managers and Councillors to plan to be on the road for a week and have some serious discussions about future community needs, to ensure that all residents and ratepayers are aware of what is happening in the current environment.

Council will have specialists in the areas of the land valuation process and local government to explain, from an independent perspective, how Council must operate under the Local Government Act 2009.

"It's clear that we need to communicate all of the factors that are relevant in budgeting, rating and levels of service

delivery," said the Mayor, Councillor Peter Maguire.

Speakers include legal specialist Tim Fynes Clinton, Pat Lyons and Alan Morton.

Cattle Sales Move to Thursdays in 2011

he Emerald Livestock Selling Association will move their Fat sale days at the Council operated Emerald Saleyards from alternate Tuesdays to a single combined sale every Thursday.

This change will become effective from the first sale in the new year, Thursday January 13.

Saleyards staff have begun construction works to split all the three panel pens. This will create 24 extra pens which will be required for the anticipated larger numbers due to the combined sales.

Council and other key stakeholders are working on a masterplan to ensure a positive future for the Saleyards. Also starting next year, all cattle will have their NLIS tags pre scanned prior to sale. Council is exploring scanning options with soft ware providers.

An Important Notice About Your Water Charges

Keep monitoring your water use as you are now charged on the amount of water you use.

You may notice some differences in charges in relation to water on this quarterly rates notice. This is because Council, has made some changes to the way in which is water is charged.

A two part tariff system has been introduced, where residents will pay the following:

- 1. An access charge, for the costs of providing the infrastructure and water service, and
- 2. A water usage charge, which is based on the actual amount of water used.

This means that ratepayers who are water conservative and water wise will be rewarded for their efforts by paying less.

A full explanation of the new charges and tips on how to use less water is included with your rates notice.

Disaster Planning - Be Prepared

A ll communities are prone to disasters, both natural events such as flooding or fires and others, such as chemical hazards. Every household can take some simple practical steps to be prepared to respond to a disaster.

All predictions indicate that we may have a wet summer ahead, so now is the time to think, prepare and act so you are not caught unawares.

- Check that you have appropriate insurance
- Ask friends and family living in higher, less flood prone areas if you can stay with them should the need arise for evacuation.
- · Have an emergency kit on hand.
- Know which local radio stations will carry warnings and information.

Tips that will assist emergency services in locating you:

If you live in a rural area and there is a chance your property could become isolated, paint your name, or the name of the property, on the roof. It is also a good idea to have your GPS location written clearly and located near your phone.

Flooding

he Central Highlands is subject to occasional extreme rainfall between November and March. If flooding is predicted

- · Listen to your radio
- Take all warnings and advice seriously
- Remove as many household items as possible to as high a point as possible, including cardboard boxes and newspaper items.
- Pile furniture on beds and personal items on the furniture and remove all drawers from built ins.
- Tie down loose items in your yard to prevent them from floating away.
- Ensure all chemicals that may react with water are within a waterproof container and are moved to a higher level.
- Gas cylinders and bottles should be disconnected and tied down or removed above flood height.
- · Close the mains water valve.
- Make sure your car is fully fuelled.
- If driving be sure of the depth of water before driving through it.





Emergency Kit Checklist

- Torch (spare batteries)
- Battery operated radio (spare batteries)
- · Candles, lighter and waterproof matches
- · First Aid Kit
- Combination pocket knife
- · Portable stove with fuel
- · Cooking utensils
- Water in sturdy sealed containers (10 litres per person)
- Medications
- · Toiletry and sanitary supplies
- Change of clothes and strong shoes
- Tinned food enough for 3 4 days
- Can opener

- Special needs for infants, older people and people with disabilities
- · Pet food, water and other animal needs
- · Tent or tarpaulin and blankets
- Money
- · Strong plastic bags
- Personal documents insurance, certificates, photos, identification (drivers licence, medicare card etc)
- · Board games, cards, etc
- Emergency contact list and mobile phone chargers
- · Insect repellant and sunscreen

ver a hundred and fifty delegates converged in Emerald on Wednesday 29 September to attend the Partnering Now For The Future Forum. The forum was hosted by Banana Shire Council, Central Highlands Regional Council and Isaac Regional Council to partner in addressing the social, economic and environmental impacts for resource communities. The forum brought together government (Local, State & Federal), industry sectors and community representatives to present information, discuss key issues and develop solutions for the future.

The Forum was opened by the Minister for Infrastructure and Planning, the Hon. Stirling Hinchliffe MP. Speakers included the Regional Executive Director for the Department of Communities, Michael Shearer, who discussed the social side of resource growth, Michael Roche from the Queensland Resources Council, and Jon Womersely, Department of Environment and Resource Management. Council Receives Award for Commitment to Women

entral Highlands Regional Council was just the second local government in Queensland to receive a bronze certification in the 50:50 Vision - Councils for Gender Equity Program. This important program is the first national accreditation and awards program to encourage councils across Australia to address gender equity issues within the organisation and among their elected representatives.

The program was launched by Minister Tanya Plibersek and Parliamentary Secretary Maxine McKew at the Australian Council of Local Governments Dinner at Parliament House held in June this year.

The program has been designed to to be accessed by all councils, regardless of their size, location and progress on gender equity. Councils can apply for accreditation at three levels - starting with Bronze and working up to the prestigious, peer reviewed Gold Award.

In 2010, the first year of the awards, Councils could only apply for the bronze award.

"In meeting this standard, Central Highlands has provided a commitment to address gender equaltiy issues, conducted a self assesment of staff/elected representative gender ratios, and has appointed Employee Services Manager Jenny Nuss as its 50:50 Vision champion to have carriage of the program within the organisation," said the Mayor.

"The Inspiring Women in the Bowen Basin Project is also a key project that Council is involved with that demonstrates our commitment to promoting the achievements of women both in the organisation, and our community."

Council Chief Executive Officer Bryan Ottone said that Council would be continuing its commitment beyond the Year of Women in Local Government by working towards achieving the Silver award.


