The McCahon, Madsen and Carnarvan bridges are closed. All dams are overflowing with substantial flows. River level at Warwick is expected to be at least 9.1m at midnight.

Stanthorpe as at 4pm today - Carnarvon Bridge may be re-opened after the water levels drop and structure is inspected, highway at Accommodation Creek still closed, Stanthorpe By-pass still open; it has been closed and reopen throughout the day.

Continued to operate the Local Disaster Management Group call centre from Warwick Council Administration Building (and sub group at Stanthorpe Council Administration Building). Held a Local Disaster Management Group Meeting today at 7:30am, 10:00am, 1:00pm, 4:00pm and another is scheduled at 8:00pm today (Stanthorpe sub group are meeting regularly, last met at 4:00pm today, next meeting at 9am 12/01/11). The Stanthorpe Incident Centre will remain open until 6pm tonight.

Evacuation Centres have been activated at WIRAC and Slade Campus in Warwick, Allora Hall and Stanthorpe Civic Centre. A second evacuation centre has been opened at the Baptist Church at the corner of Hillcrest and Railway Street, Stanthorpe in the event the town in divided.

Council staff have been inspecting and closing roads as needed.

An additional two farm Dams (Wren Valley turf and Sunnyside) on Back Creek Road, Severnlea at risk. Phil Gibb assisting with Excavator to increase by-wash

Council staff have been inspecting and closing roads as needed. Two farm dams near Storm King Dam at risk; Council staff and excavator on site; assessing if its practical and safe to increase the by-wash capacity.

Warwick and Stanthorpe SES have door knocked potential flood affected areas to warn residents/businesses.

As at 12.40pm Stanthorpe SES had not been deployed for any further incidents. They assisted Council by boating personnel to the opposite side of Storm King Dam so an operator could access Council's Excavator and allow them to increase the by-wash on the private dams.

The Granite Belt Medical Centre will be available for 24 hours and doctors are on-call to attend at any time if the hospital is not available.

Stanthorpe - the situation at Morello's dam is under control. Tractors cleaning out by-wash and trying to maintaining steady flow. By lunchtime had lowered water level in the dam by ½ a metre. Approx 30 houses inundated approx 4-6 inches above floor boards.

Richard Harslett's dam – the water level had reduced by the afternoon by 1/2m, so the outflow was higher than the inflow. Stabilised

National Parks & Wildlife advised that Girraween National Park is closed; power and phone outages.

The LDMG in Warwick has moved into recovery phase and is no longer operating on a 24 hour basis. The Stanthorpe Sub Group is also in recovery mode and are no longer operating on a 24 hour basis.

All major highways to/from Warwick and Stanthorpe have been reopened. The Cunningham Highway is open from Yamanto to Goondiwindi. The New England Highway is open from Toowoomba to the NSW border to all traffic.

Evacuation Centre in Stanthorpe is now closed and all evacuees have been relocated and no longer require accommodation.

The Warwick Evacuation Centre at WIRAC has been closed and all remaining evacuees have been moved to Slade School. There are currently 24 evacuees and this number is predicted to decline during the day.

Council staff have inspected roads and reopened roads when safe for vehicle travel.

5. Projected Operations For Next 24/48 Hours

(Major problems next 24/48 hours. Anticipated resource requirements, including food re-supply)

Waiting on water levels to recede further to assess damage to roads and infrastructure, this may result in roads being reclosed to repair and ensure safety of motorists.

Both Warwick and Stanthorpe Coordination Centres will operate from 8am to 5pm with on call Council staff are available outside of these hours.

Council have made enquiries in relation to food, fuel and medical supplies. Whilst levels have been depleted, there are no major issues identified in the next 24-48 hour period. This is anticipated to decline as roads reopen and businesses are able to source supplies from different locations.

Slade Evacuation Centre currently has 24 evacuees and Council and support agencies are attempting to relocate these people. It is anticipated that the evacuation centre will be closed within the next 24 hours.

All resources that are required to complete the recovery process are able to be sourced locally from Council and local organisations. No additional resources are required at this time.

Department of Communities and other welfare agencies are setting up a Community Recovery Centre at the Warwick Town Hall for community welfare issues and to discuss relief and funding avenues for those affected.

One flood affected medical service in Stanthorpe is operating from the Stanthorpe Hospital.
