

17 Jan 2011, 3pm: Massive Damage Unfolds Following Dumaresq Flooding

Goondiwindi Council Mayor Graeme Scheu has been able to get out of Goondiwindi to Inspect first hand some of the damage that was caused upstream during the recent floods

"The sheer velocity of the water must have been unbellevable as it rose so quickly," Mayor Scheu said while visiting the Glenarbon, Beebo & Keetah area late yesterday

There have been major stock and crop losses all along the Dumaresq River however thankfully, no loss of life has occurred. That's always number one. How everyone survived this mammoth flood is incredible as there was limited warning time available to those on this section of the river."

Further up in Texas on the river flats, hundreds of round bales of hay are strewn over the flat, some resting up against houses. While stock losses in and around the Texas Township appear minimal, the loss of crops has been extraordinary. The major part of the Texas Township remained high and dry however the flats and old Texas town stood little chance against the torrent.

The Texas Racecourse that lies in the middle of the flat has encountered major problems losing nearly the entire new running rail recently completed. Buildings have been upfitted and placed in the middle of the track. Mayor Scheu has spoken with Queensland Racing explaining the sheer devastation that has occurred at this complex and Council will assist when the massive working bee takes place.

The majority of residents on the flat moved to higher ground in Texas and face the daunting job of moving back to their houses. A massive clean up took place on Friday and Saturday with workers from the Silver Mine being redeployed to assist the local residents in trouble.

Council will be placing skip bins in areas along the Texas River flats while rural residents are asked to place their waste in piles along the road side and notify Council when doing so.

Further upstream the Riverton Road area was not spared either. Twisted irrigation infrastructure lay strewn all over the river flats as the clean up begins. The major concern is the road as farmers along this stretch of the river require a suitable road system to deliver produce to markets while local school bus runs are also an essential part of life in this area and with school recommencing in a few days, there is major concern for these services.

Council will have engineers in both the Riverton and Beebo areas as soon as possible as Council begin the arduous task of rebuilding the infrastructure.

Further inspections of damage in the Yelarbon to Goondwindi area will take place later today.

The immediate concern however is the peak of the flood water which is now west of Goondwindi and threatening properties in the Toobeah, Bungunya and Talwood flood areas

Council is carefully monitoring the situation and flaising closely with residents and property owners towards these areas as the massive volume of water continues to move downstream.



STAY OUT OF FLOODED CREEKS AND WATCH FOR SNAKES AND OTHER NASTIES!

Goondiwindi Regional Council is reminding residents how vitally important it is to stay out of flooded creeks.

Council's Mayor, Cr Graeme Scheu says in addition to submerged objects and fast flowing rivers snakes are heading out of flooded areas and are not happy.

"We are getting plenty of reports of snakes and other nasty little blighters, particularly in the Brigatow area," Or Scheu says.

Children especially should be wearing closed in shoes at all times.

In addition, flood waters harbour many health risks.

'We've all seen the health concerns being expressed with the Brisbane flooding - these risks apply to all floodwaters, not just those in the cities," Cr Scheu says.

"Wading or playing in flood waters is hazardous due to the risk of drowning and getting skin infections from open cuts and viral infections so just make sure you don't go in," he says.

Cr Scheu emphasised that the town water supply is perfectly safe and that health risks are posed only by flood waters.

"There are absolutely no concerns for the quality of our town water supply.



Record major flood levels at Goondiwindi have peaked at 10.64 metres overnight.

At 7am Saturday, the flood level at Goondiwindi was 10.55 and continuing to fall slowly.

Flood levels are expected to remain above 9.5 metres until overnight Sunday.

Goondiwindi Regional Council Mayor, Cr Graeme Scheu says that areas of the Glenoak Estate have experienced some overnight flooding however there are no reports of inundation to houses at this stage.

Please be very aware of snakes which are moving into residential areas as they have all been flooded out and moving to higher areas – especially in that Brigatow Creek area.

Or Scheu stressed to residents in the area to be extremely careful as there are many snakes moving around.

In other matters, nine residents took up the option of staying at the Evacuation Centre last night and there was only one report of a non serious flood related incident.

'Please remember all roads in and out of Goondivindi are currently closed however we don't think the Cunningham Highway will be cut for a significant length of time," he says

Council staff will continue to monitor the levee bank around the clock to ensure any Issues are addressed immediately.

"A few minor leaks have been expected and these are addressed very quickly and effectively," Cr Scheu says.

"We have no concern about the levee structurally," he says.

The focus of concern is now moving to those residents on rural properties west of Goondiwindi and we are liaising closely with property owners to ensure everyone is ok."

14 January 2011 3.45pm

The McIntyre River at Goondiwindi at 3.00PM is at 10.64m and has been steady at this level since 7am this morning.

Goondiwindi Regional Council Mayor, Cr Graeme Scheu says that while he is confident the peak of 10.85 metres currently estimated by the Bureau of Meterology will not be reached, it is the experts who must make the call although he is confident that we may be reaching a peak.

"I understand many local residents are becoming a little frustrated with the wait and see situation however I do urge patience as we must remember we are in unexplored territory." Or Scheu says.

The Bureau expects the river to remain above the 10 metre mark at Goondiwindi well into Saturday so our staff will continue their terrific work patrolling the levee 24/7 until the river returns to its banks at 9.5 metres."

"Stage 1 (voluntary evacuation low tying areas) advice still remains in place," he says. As the rapidly rising Brigalow Creek is beginning to impact on the Glenoak Estate area north of the airport and all highways out and into town are now closed.

While there are currently no patrons at the Evacuation Centre the facility is still available and anyone wishing to evacuate should simply call Council's 24 hour customer service line 07 4671 4671.

"We have contacted rural properties to the west of town as they will now start to see the waters impact upon their properties." "We really feel for these people as the water will have a terrible impact upon their liveslock, equipment and crops."

It is anticipated that the Goondiwindi Hospital may reopen on Monday when the river level is expected to be below the 9.5 metre mark.

A temporary hospital field unit has been established at the Goondiwindi Airport.

14 January 2011 8.30am

The McIntyre River at Goondivindi at 8.00am is at 10.64m equating to an average increase of 1centimetre per hour for the last 5 hours.

Goondiwindi Regional Council Mayor, Cr Graeme Scheu says that due to the huge volume of water it is incredibly difficult for the Bureau of Meteorology to predict the peak.

The Bureau has confirmed it has peaked at Boggabilla at 5.00am with a flow time to Goondiwindi of 5 to 6 hours.

The expected peak at Goondiwindi is anticipated to arrive around midday.

"We are not yet at the peak of the river, we cannot say it is over," Or Scheu says.

The Bureau expects the river to remain above the 10 metre mark at Goondiwindi well into Saturday.

"We will continue to maintain 24 hour monitoring of the levee bank until the river recedes to around the 9.5 mark when we will review assessment of current arrangements,"
Or School cave

*Please remember the river is still rising and the Stage 1 (voluntary evacuation low lying areas) advice still remains in place," he says.

The Evacuation Centre at the showgrounds will remain open for this morning at least.

The 'Glenoak Estate' north of the area is still under threat.

'The Brigalow Creek is, and will continue to push through the Glenoak Estate area for some time while the river level remains high," Cr Scheu says.

It is anticipated that the Goordiwindi Hospital may reopen on Monday when the river level is expected to be below the 9.5 metre mark.

A temporary hospital field unit has been established at the Goondiwindi Airport.





STAGE TWO

The Local Disaster Management Committee has just met to discuss precautionary measures.

At this point in time and based on current expectations Country Energy does not emisage any loss of power to urban residents.

A total of 63 patients from Kaloma Home for the Aged and the Goondiwindi Hospital are currently being evacuated as a precautionary measure only.

The Committee does not envisage that any other evacuations will be required however arrangements for potential evacuation arrangements are being finalised should the unforeseen need arise.

Residents are advised to NOT attempt to leave town as many roads are flooded and these floodwaters will increase during the afternoon and evening.

Should evacuations be required individual residents will be advised.

Another release will be Issued as soon as information becomes available. The Committee will be reconvening at 7.00pm.

13 January 2011 2.00pm

The Bureau of Meteorology has just advised the Local Disaster Management Committee that the river level at Goondwindi Is expected to reach 10.85 metres with possible further rises.

Council Mayor, Graeme Scheu says the hydrologists advise that due to the record volume of water in the Upper MacIntyre and Dumaresq Rivers, Goondwindi is likely to experience a record flow in the river.

"We are now heading into unknown territory as the current modelling cannot be based on historical events," Cr Scheu says.

All residents outside the town levee area (including rural properties) should take all appropriate steps to ensure protection to property and people.

As a precautionary measure it is strongly recommended that businesses and residents within the town levee should take measures to ensure valuable items are stored in a dry area.

As a further precaution, the Local Disaster Management Group and Queensland Health are currently meeting to consider relocating patients and residents of aged care and health facilities.

Another release will be issued as soon as information becomes available.



Assistance for Flood Affected Properties

Goondiwindi Regional Council residents and business owners directly affected by recent flood events may be eligible for government assistance.

Primary producers and small businesses affected by floods in Goondiwindi Regional Council area are eligible to apply for low interest loans under the Natural Disaster Scheme.

Loans of up to \$250,000 for replanting, restocking, sustenance, payment of rates, replacing buildings and operating costs can be applied for with a current interest rate of 4% and a repayment term of up to 7 years with no fees or charges.

Council's Deputy Mayor and Chair of the Disaster Management Committee, Cr Rick Kearney says Council is liaising closely with the State Government in an effort to have some parts of the Regional Council area recognised under the Natural Disaster Relief Arrangements.

"If we can secure that recognition additional grant assistance of up to \$25,000 may be available to some property owners," Cr Kearney says.

"We are hoping to receive advice in that regard by the end of this week," he says.





Flood Information Update

12 January 2011 2.30pm

At 2.30pm Wednesday 12 January the following flood information was current:

Texas: Has now peaked at 10.5 metres with significant water in some areas.

Yelarbon: Currently cut to the east but spared of any major flooding.

Inglewood: Peaked at 9.2 metres and spared of any major flooding.

Talwood: Will become isolated as the Barwon closes and further reports will come to hand in the coming days.

Welr River: Peaked today at Don O'Connor's at 11.8 metres but a sharp rise is expected in the Weir River.

No major changes have been made to the previous reports.

It is expected that the peak of 10.7 metres will hit Goondwindi in the early hours of Friday morning or late Thursday night.

Once again, residents are requested to stay out of the water no matter how inviting it may look. It is one of the most dangerous hazards in a flood event.

No Evacuations are planned for Goondiwindi however some residents in low lying areas have been advised to move their gear to higher ground.

Evacuations have been ordered for Toomelah and Boggabilla to Moree however these primarily relate to some low lying areas and the possibility of interruptions to essential services. This evacuation does not bear any significance to flood heights in Goondiwindi.

Further, Goondiwindi residents should not get confused with flood heights announced for Boggabilla as the measuring station at Boggabilla is significantly different to that of the Goondiwindi Bridge.

Council will be monitoring the progress of the flood closely with staff employed during Thursday night's expected peak. Staff will be monitoring the rise during Thursday night and those residents on the levee bank are asked to have all dogs restrained during the night as staff complete their duties.

A further meeting will be held at 3pm tomorrow (Thursday) and an evening Press Release will be available on Council's website - www.grc.qid.gov.au, ABC Radio as well as the local Tourist Radio 88.0 FM at approximately 4.30pm.

Flood Update for Goondiwindi Town Area

12 January, 2011 6.00am

Residents are advised that a major flood of up to 10.7 metres at the Goondiwindi Bridge is expected overnight Thursday night and early Friday morning. This height is somewhat similar to the flood experienced in Goondiwindi in 1996.

Most residents of the town are not expected to experience any significant issues.

Residents and businesses in the Glenoak Road precinct and the area west of West Street may expect some flooding of properties. At this stage it is uncertain whether houses and businesses in some lower parts of these areas may be impacted however residents are encouraged to move equipment to higher ground and raise furniture and tools particularly in sheds and known low lying areas. Those in these lower areas should consider making arrangements to move to friends or neighbours should the situation deteriorate over coming days.

It is possible that roads in these areas will be covered by surface water such that they will only be accessible to high clearance vehicles. Residents should prepare accordingly by storing appropriate provisions and making sure that they have sufficient supplies of medications etc.

Residents are encouraged to stay abreast of developments via Council's website www.grc.qtd.gov.au. Council will make general announcements through the ABC and other media and websites. Those in the Glenoak Road precinct and west of West Street will be provided with a further update via flyer by midday Thursday when more definite information is likely to be available.

"Once again I would like to remind everyone of the potential danger of flooded rivers, please do not take any unnecessary risks such as swimming or boating in the rivers when there are rises," Cr Scheu says. STAY AWAY FROM THE RIVER!

Meanwhile in other areas of the region there have been limited evacuations in the town of Texas where they are expecting a river peak of up to 10.5 metres while Inglewood is expected to remain relatively unaffected with only moderate flooding with the McIntyre Brook expected to peak at 9 metres. Yelarbon is not expected to see any impacts as a result of these events.

Rural areas and small towns west of Goondiwindi have been hard hit with many properties inundated.

"I remind people to contact the SES on 132 500 should they require assistance. If it is a life threatening emergency remember to utilise the 000 system".



Flood Alert for Goondiwindi Town Area

11 January 2011 2.00pm

Residents are advised that a flood warning is current for the Goondiwindi area.

At this point in time a major flood height of around 10.5 metres is expected on Thursday, just below the record 1996 event.

Council's Mayor, Cr Graeme Scheu says residents should be taking necessary precautions to protect property in the event of flooding.

"The current forecast indicates only a limited low lying area of the town is likely to be affected, however any significant rainfall over the catchment in the next 24 hours may impact significantly on the expected heights," Cr Scheu says.

The Local Disaster Management Group met at 1.00pm this afternoon to commence preliminary flood coordination activities.

Cr Scheu says while people should take reasonable steps to ensure they have adequate supplies in the event of road closures etc but THERE IS NO NEED TO PANIC BUY or take extreme action.

'For example get to the chemist and fill your prescriptions if you only have one or two days supply left," Or Scheu suggests.

"We believe we will have a clearer picture of anticipated flood heights at 6.00pm this evening but at this stage the levee is not expected to be breached," he says.

'What I would like to remind everyone is the potential danger of flooded rivers, please do not take any unnecessary risks such as swimming or boating in the rivers when there are rises," Cr Scheu says. STAY AWAY FROM THE RIVER!

"We have spoken the Police who will take action against anyone taking unnecessary risks if required," Cr Scheu says.

Meanwhile in other areas of the region there have been limited evacuations in the town of Texas (9 metres) while Inglewood is expected to remain relatively unaffected with only minor flooding expected to peak at 8 metres.

it is not anticipated that Yelarbon will experience major difficulties.

Areas west of Goondwindi have been hard hit with many properties inundated and the town of Talwood still remains isolated.

Council's Acting Mayor, Cr Rick Kearney says that although we will see a rise in the river there is no cause for concern.

"The flood pumps are designed to allow local drainage back into the river when the flood gates are closed due to the river level," Or Kearney said.

"The activation of the pumps do not indicate in any way that the river level will rise above the levee," he said.
