SITUATION OVERVIEW

1. Weather

(Local observations)

Moderate to major flooding continues in the Lockyer and Warrill Creeks and the Bremer River. A second minor flood peak of 8.5 metres is expected at Ipswich during Tuesday afternoon.

LOCKYER CREEK:

Moderate to major flooding continues in Lockyer Creek. River level rises causing major flooding will continue in the Lyons Bridge area with a peak up to 16 metres expected during Tuesday.

The heavy rainfall has now cleared the area with only lighter rain is expected during Tuesday.

- Reports of properties cut off by roads closed Brightview, Glenore Grove, Lockrose,
- A number of an people (estimated 50-100 people) are cut off up the following roads Left Hand Branch Rd, Ingolsby Rd, Dry Gully Rd, Black Duck Creek Rd and all roads running off these roads. Council is attempting to gain access however due to the severe damage an aerial re-supply is likey to be needed tomorrow. Council will assess this in the morning.
- A number of land slips blocking roads
- Major damage to roads in the flagstone creek/rockmount/stockyard area. Flodways are washed out, a large amount of silt on floodways. High clearance 4wd access only at this point in time.

- Mt Sylvia Road is cut at the floodway near Laffeys Rd. The crossing is flooded with fast flowing water and there appears to be major damage to the crossing. Until the water lowers and a better assessment can be made council will not be attempting to cross the floodway. Alternate access via West Haldon Rd can not be gained due to Gatton-Clifton from the LVRC end. Toowoomba Regional Council are going to attempt to access Mt Sylvia Rd via West Haldon Rd. There has been a report of the road slipping on west haldon from a local.
- If access can be gained via West Haldon Council will then need to attempt to access properties on Black Duck Creek Road.
- Council is attempting to gain access however due to the severe damage an aerial re-supply is likely to be needed today or tomorrow.
- High clearance 4wd drive access has been gained to Ingolsby road and Hall rd
- The first crossing on Left Hand Branch Rd should be opened by 1100. Further works are expected
 to be needed further up the road to gain access.

- Mt Sylvia Road is cut at the floodway near Laffeys Rd. The crossing is flooded with fast flowing water and there appears to be major damage to the crossing. Until the water lowers and a better assessment can be made council will not be attempting to cross the floodway. A Toowoomba regional council (TRC) foreman has accessed mt Sylvia rd via west haldon rd. DTMR engineer & TRC tech officer have inspected west haldon rd and reported that the road has undermined and sunk approx 100mm (1km past morris rd). Road is not safe for use by heavy vehicles until repairs can be undertaken. LVRC crews are repairing road, this may take until am on the 30/12.
- Access to junction view may still take a day once councils equipment reaches mt Sylvia rd.
- Access to Black Duck Creek Rd and East Haldon road may not be possible for another 2-4 days
- Request sent to DDMG requesting re-supply for people who have contacted SES in urgent need of re-supply. Request also asks if 2 loader operators can be dropped into the chalk mine quarry to start working from the southern end.
- High clearance 4wd drive access has been gained to ingolsby road and Hall rd
- The first crossing on Left Hand Branch Rd is open. Works continue clearing landslips and fixing crossinas

SITUATION OVERVIEW

1. Damage assessment Overview

Heavy rain and storms in December resulted in the activation of the Local Disaster Coordination Centre on 26th December, 2010 because of the resultant flooding around the region. The Coordination centre was deactivated on 5th January, 2011 but reactivated on 6th January due to further flooding and high stream levels.

On 10th January, 2011 a severe storm caused major damage and loss of life in the towns of Withcott, Helidon, Murphy's Creek and Grantham. Further heavy rain in the following days resulted in flooding in many areas of the region including but not limited to Mulgowie, Laidley, Plainland and Lockrose and continued flooding in the Withcott, Helidon, Murphy's Creek and Grantham areas.

Extensive damage has occurred to buildings, roads and infrastructure in all areas of the Lockyer Valley. Engineers are currently in the area conducting inspections of houses, roads, bridges and infrastructure.

SITUATION OVERVIEW

1. Weather

(Local observations)

The main flood waters in the Lockyer Creek are now arriving at Lyons Bridge, with strong stream rises expected during Tuesday.

Wivenhoe dam is providing significant mitigation of upper Brisbane floods. River flows from the Bremer and Lockyer catchments combined with releases from Wivenhoe dam are expected to increase levels in Brisbane during Tuesday.

At the Brisbane City Gauge, minor flood levels of about 2.1 metres are expected with the afternoon high tide on Tuesday and levels of about 3 metres are expected with the high tides on Wednesday causing moderate flooding.

(3 metres at the Brisbane City gauge is about 1.5 metres higher than the highest tide of the year at this location).

CKYER CREEK:

Attremely heavy rainfall during Monday led to extreme rises in the Lockyer Creek catchment and Laidley Creek at Mulgowie. Record flood levels of 18.92 metres were recorded at Gatton Monday evening before the station failed. This level was well above the previous record peak of 16.33 metres from the February 1893 flood.

The main flood waters are currently arriving at Lyons Bridge, with strong stream rises expected in the next few hours. The Lockyer Creek at Glenore Grove peaked at 14.60 metres at 11:30pm, which is 0.3 metres below the 1974 flood.

Renewed stream rises have commenced in Lockyer Creek at Lyons Bridge with a peak between 16 and 16.5 metres expected Tuesday morning. This is likely to be similar in level to the 1996 flood.



## Update as at 21 January 2011

Initial Rapid Impact Assessment conducted by QFRS amounted to 185 properties that required attention and further inspection.

From this inspection 140 were considered unsafe and not occupied.

#### 2. Damage assessment Overview

#### Update as at 19 January 2011

<u>Postmans Ridge</u> – 60 properties likely to have flood damage. Also some properties may be isolated to damage to private driveways over Lockyer Creek.

Withcott – 40 homes affected by water. Houses currently cleaned. Electrical assessments to be undertaken.

<u>Helidon</u> – approx. 52 properties (including Helidon Spa) affected by flood. Twidales Rd causeway destroyed isolating 3 properties including cat & dog kennels.

<u>Laidley</u> – 2000 homes have been inundated by floodwater, clean up completed barring 30 homes at White View and Glenore Grove.

Murphys Creek – 86 houses affected by Water, 1 by landslide at Stephans Rd. Recomm and welfare underway and recovery works progressing.

Outlying Areas – currently have 76 properties known for flood related damage, however full assessment of all areas has not been undertaken. Clean up and recovery still to be commenced.

### Update as at 21 January 2011

Initial Rapid Impact Assessment conducted by QFRS amounted to 185 properties that required attention and further inspection.

From this inspection 140 were considered unsafe and not occupied.

Dept of Communities is currently undertaking a more detailed assessment of identified properties to determine requirements.

#### Grantham

Category 1& 2 houses are currently being cleaned and awaiting restoration of utilities.
Category 3, 4, 5, are still unsafe and working through housing solutions, (demolition, re-homing, locations etc)

QFRS Hazmat team removing volatile agricultural Chemicals

SES volunteers (40) continuing search for missing persons. Army also assigned personnel to assist with missing person search

Army providing debris removal around streets and houses clean-ups. Also providing heavy equipment and 100 personnel to commence heavy lift debris removal.

## Updated as at the 30 January 2011

Suspected public health issue raised by the contractor engaged by Council upon notification Council sort independent advice from the office of workplace health and safety (Peter McGarry)who advised that while there is asbestos situated throughout the clean up area most of the material is of a bonded asbestos type representing a low risk to resident and workers in Grantham, A number of minor PPE and clean up procedures were identified by

the WHS to ensure all residents and volunteers remain safety whilst undertaking clean up activities. Further to these procedures he has suggested Council obtain a number of air monitors in the affected area to continue to monitor the level of air purification in the affected area.

Council met with 2 structural engineers from Department of Public Works and arrangements have been made for a team of structural engineers to visit the Lockyer valley Region to assess all homes within the Lockyer Valley for structural deficiencies and ways in which dwellings may be shored to enable residents to retrieve personal belongings
