Water expected to enter Surat on the evening 3/1/11 and 4/1/11 and remain until at least the 6/1/11.

Water to be at St George on the 13/1/11 and remain until the 13/1/11.

Dirranbandi levy bank being worked on and closed in preparation.

Six QPS staff have been requested from Brisbane and will be rostered at St George 24/7.

DDMG will wait for requests from the LDMG

Issues:- Recovery efforts for Surat

DEEDI:- have been receiving request for animal food.

MSC:- Revising info on predicted levels in the town area.

16KVA has been sourced to run water plant

At the predicted 13.5m no inundation tis expected to the town streets at Surat

3 x QPS staff deployed to Surat

QFRS, SES and Council staff plus additional equipments has been deployed into Surat.

Surat QAS staff x 2 business as usual

TELSTRA:- DDMG requested 6 x Fly Away kits to be delivered to St George by 6/1/11

ERGON:- Only two houses have been cut to power which are located on the river
Should be no major issues with predicted water height

QFRS:- Additional staff in Surat
2 x Swift water rescue staff to be sent to St George
Senior Officer now sitting on St George LDMG

EMQ:- Mark Kelly to replace Scott Walsh tomorrow phone number unchanged.
Rotation of SES staff occurring in all areas.

Minutes – 03.01.2011 1400hrs

- Information received from BoM – Surat looking at levels in excess of 13.5m & St George in excess of 14m by end of the week. 80-85% population of St George could be inundated as a result.
- Field hospital already set up as requested and set up in Robin FUHRMEISTER's on the St George-Surat Road, approx 1km north of town.
- Arrangements still being made for evacuation of Weerawee patients. Additional request sent through to SDCC requesting 22 carers to accompany aircraft as a result of concerns raised at meeting.
- RFA forwarded to Water Police/Fisheries. Dispatched at 1500hrs.
- St George evacuation centre to now be set up to allow catering for 200pax.
- No view of Communities being able to access Surat by road until next week.
- St George LDMG reassessing plans as a result of newly expected flood levels.
- QAS representative voiced concerns re staffing levels and availability of access to patients.
- QFRS representative raised concerns re vehicular access to the airstrip; snr officer on the ground now in St George.
- Swift water crew to be rotated on Thursday, replacement crew to arrive in Roma on Wednesday, arrangements to be made for transport of 4 in, 4 out; request made for swift water crew to be present for any movements; grape picking for 2 days at River Sands; to follow up possible flexible accommodation – 362pax accommodation, water & toilets, but not food.
- Telstra representative to organise flyaway kits on 04.01.2011; believes that sandbagging may be required at the exchange if levels rise above 14.5m.
- Qld Health representative stated that there were approx 4 high care patients & 6 inpatients.
- All external agencies asked to address staffing, accommodation, feeding, etc of emergency staff for DDMG on 04.01.2011.

Roma DDMG Minutes – 04.01.2011

Chair

- Surat at 12.76m, no more recorded inundations and no further forecast inundations
- St George expected to be at 13m on Thursday, 13.4m on Friday, 14m over the weekend, and possibly in excess of 14m next Monday & Tuesday
- Nil issues with Dirranbandi, only .2m higher than March 2010 floods
- More rain expected approx Wednesday & Thursday 50-120ml, impact unknown at this stage
- RFA for bedding to go to the St George evacuation centre revisited, arrangements made to have this actioned
- QFRS flexible habitat can be made available for government/emergency staff if required
- 12 x QPS staff to be in St George by the end of this week

Balonne Shire

- At 14m, St George will have approx 50 houses with water in/around/under them; 30 with water in them
- With regard to power, half the capacity has been lost to supply; looking at flying people and parts in on 04.01.2011 to rectify the issues; request has been made locally for air con usage to be lessened to assist in the interim
- At 14m, occupants of the hospital will be transferred to the field hospital
- RFA to be arranged for generator in St George

QFRS

- At 14m, the station will be isolated; plans are in place to relocate resources
- 4 x staff will be affected at 14m
- 4 x staff + 1 Snr officer are now on the ground in St George, with accommodation
- 2 x swift water staff have been redeployed to St George from Surat
- Flexible habitat can be made available if required

EMQ

- 2 x staff in St George with a view to send more staff out from Toowoomba
- SES crew transported to St George on 04.01.2011
- 6 x staff may be affected at 14m

MRC

- Nil issues/comments, happy with Surat outcome

- Diesel tanker moved in to fuel machines building levee banks
- Evacuation centre ready, bedding sourced and on site
- 2 x Water Police and Boating & Fisheries staff in St George as at 04.01.2011

All services – to operate as per normal business plans, however once in St George, LDMG will assist with the delivery of resources due to flooding

2 x C130 to St George on the 06.01.2011 + 17 x personnel to support & maintain aircraft

Telstra

- At 14.5m, they will shut down the exchange however at 14m they'll sandbag the exchange and pump water out if needed (brick building)
- If exchange goes down, mobile coverage is still ok but impact on mobile tower will be grossly affected depending on voice or data traffic
- Other DDMG members stated that they utilise mobile data and this facility is needed to continue fluent operations
- Mobile tower to be sourced to backup exchange.

- Tony SMITH to provide statistics & forecast how much traffic would go through the St George tower, however did state that there may be other priorities within the state for this equipment i.e. Rockhampton

Ergon

- Have on standby 2 x 350 generators, 9.5 tonne each, and a 1 tonne fuel cell located in Brisbane. Brought forward should the need arise in St George.
- No staffing issues
- Specialist will be deployed to the area to support equipment.
- At this stage, plenty of time to isolate power supply to customers due to slow rising waters.
- All assets high & dry
- Generator to be delivered to Hebel as backup should the Hebel line go down.
- Currently only 1 customer off line
- Indicated that if 14m level is reached, fine but any higher may be an issue
- Level of substation has been checked
- Expressed concerns re the Bollon feeder from St George, running across the river; may pose a danger to boats when the water rises. Task forwarded to OIC St George for the attention of water police to take enforcement action

QFRS

- Flexible habitat ordered
- Swift Water staff to change over in St George on 06.01.2011, 2 x additional staff to St George + 2 remain in Surat, total of 6 across the district
- 2 x air op staff into St George on 05.01.2011

MRC

- No issues brought to the floor except a Surat resident used an SES form to obtain funds from Centrelink for unknown reason. Stephen MOW & S/Sgt FENTON to discuss this matter further

QBuild

- Reinforced to all members that RFA's must come through the DDC

DEEDI

- Staff accommodated ok, more work will be done after water subsides

- Dirranbandi doctor has been replaced
- Attending to a 36yr old pregnant woman, encouraged to leave the area, may pose a problem at a later date

- Overview conducted by DDC & Deputy DDC saw that Surat experienced flooding as highlighted on mapping produced
- Dirranbandi expected to be isolated for approx 4 weeks
- Hebel/Thallon are not a source of concern

Telstra

- Feel confident with planning/protection of infrastructure up to & including 14.7m
- Mobile facility can be sourced but information/statistics collated suggest that with the downgrade is expected water levels, that this facility will not be required

- 7 x inpatients at St George hospital, all expected to discharge over the coming days
- RFA may be coming through re the transfer of 1 x patient from St George to Pinaroo
- Immunisations/boosters being offered to all emergency services personnel & available at the St George hospital
- Hospital is still operational but will be evacuated at 13.5m

DDMG MEETING MINUTES – 11.01.2011 @ 1400HRS

Chaired by S/Sgt FENTON

Called for the purpose of re-supply issues

Roma

- Roma has missed the last 12 warehouse deliveries due to road closures/weather
- No road or rail access
- Food supply organisations in Roma – Woolworths, IGA, Western Wholesalers and PFD Food Services
- There is no fresh fruit or vegetables in town
- Woolworths and IGA both advised that it is a wait and see until the Warrego Highway is opened again as both their distribution centres are in Brisbane. I believe that to get these organisations to look at alternative supply routes we need to get their senior management involved
- IGA is controlling the supply of their food on their shelves so most people have a chance of purchasing their needs.
- Western Wholesalers and PFD both state that they have sufficient supplies at the moment of most other goods e.g. canned foods, frozen bread etc.
- TMR has advised that they will let high clearance vehicles cross the Surat bridge when the water above the bridge reaches a maximum of 300mm
- The possible route for resupplying Roma / Mitchell area identified is from Dubbo through Bourke / Cunnamulla / Charleville / Morven as the highways along this route are open as on today. However, this route has been damaged by previous floods and potholed at some sections of the highways. Some sections of highways under DTMR control may have to implement reduced speed limit to ensure traffic safety. In addition, I understand from RTA, although the highway from Cunnamulla to Dubbo is open, there are 3.5m width and 18 ton gross mass restrictions from QLD/NSW border to Dubbo. I also understand from RTA that the highways from Dubbo to Sydney are open. Landsborough Highway to the north of Augathella is open but the pavement at some sections had been damaged and heavily potholed. For the conditions of Landsborough Highway in Central West Region, please contact Barcaldine office

Miles

- Information from IGA and Foodworks in Miles is that they will be pretty much out of fresh produce this afternoon
- Large volume of panic buying occurring
- This means fruit; vegetables, bread and milk will probably run out this afternoon
- IGA think they have some milk coming tomorrow. Foodworks has no milk coming tomorrow
- The baker has flour enough to bake tonight and then will need to source flour from outside Miles. Last time it had to come in by helicopter
- Large number of people from out of town stuck here at the moment. They all seem to be driving to Miles as it is as far as they can get now to the east

- In excess of 80 b-doubles, road trains etc parked in Miles
- Council people and police on the ground in Condamine currently advising people of their options
- The Condamine population will either relocate this afternoon by SES flood boat to friends in Miles or evacuation centre that is up and running at civic centre in Miles being manned by Red Cross
- Dogwood Creek is rising on the western side of Miles but do not know exactly how far it will go
- Residents to be relocated from Condamine to Miles

Injune

- 1 day remaining of frozen fruit & vegetables, and frozen meat
- 1 week supply remaining for other general products

Surat

- No limit at this stage for the Surat bridge

Mitchell

- OK at this stage; service out of Charleville

St George

- Butchers are closed
- 3 weeks supply of fruit & vegetables
- 1 day supply available at Foodworks
- Milk available for a couple of days
- Bakery can supply for another 3 weeks
